## MICROSOFT CERTIFICATE CLASSES

Earn college credit and work toward Microsoft Certification at the same time! CTC-PFEC introduced a Microsoft Certification Program in November 2005. The classes prepare students to take Microsoft Certification exams from qualified testing centers. Students who pass the Microsoft Exams are eligible for Microsoft Certification (from Microsoft). Students can also apply the college credit they earn to their degree plan to satisfy elective credit. CTC Microsoft Certification classes and corresponding Microsoft Exams are:
